




MCPA'S SUPPORT OF THE SPECIAL OLYMPICS

MARCH & SEPTEMBER CLE RECAPS ADVANCED ONLINE REPUTATION MANAGEMENT (ORM) FOR ATTORNEYS AND CLIENTS

"A reputation once broken may possibly be repaired, but the world will always keep their eyes on the spot where the crack was." ~Joseph Hall

But what is a reputation? A reputation, simply put, is how the public/outside world views us as a result of their impressions, emotions and perceptions.

It is fitting that Mr. Hall, a software developer and programming consultant would articulate such a quote. Or simply put in terms, for today's Millennials it would read "An online reputation once broken.....".

Our online reputations are becoming increasingly important in our daily lives and workplaces. With regard to the legal world online reputations can be the difference between getting the job or keeping the client, to name a couple. The navigation of online reputation and it's potential pitfalls can be overwhelming, but fear not! #MCPA's good friend Sameer S. Somal gave us two very informative presentations ("Intro to Online Reputation Management for Attorneys and Clients" and "Advanced Online Reputation Management for Attorneys and Clients") educating us on how to deal with those cracks. Here's a quick recap:

What is Online Reputation Management? As Sameer explains, Online Reputation Management or ORM is "the process of building, monitoring and repairing digital content that appears when someone looks up a company or individual on the internet."

This can apply to attorneys/firms due to disgruntled clients because of adverse case outcomes or negative staff interactions. Another way may be due to competing attorneys trying to steal clients. These outcomes can be troublesome to an attorney/firm because they grow their business based off positive results and [online] reputations. In an effort to keep that online reputation positive and firm/client growth steady and improving a Social Media Policy should be considered taking into account professional liability, client privacy and professional ethics.

Client-based ORM could rear its head in the form of internet defamation. A false statement of fact posted publicly to more than one person with intended malice in an attempt to damage or tarnish someone's reputation via a blog post or podcast (think political ads) are simple examples.

How can we fix it? An attempt to curb this negative ORM can be done by controlling what populates on search engines or pushing down/removing negative content which is known as suppression. While simple, those types of tactics don't always work. So now what? Well, taking the easier route, this can be accomplished by courteously, respectfully asking the adverse simply to take down the negative content. Easier said than done. Short of those channels being unsuccessful then a threat of litigation or actual litigation may need to be used.



When your attorney/firm is faced with a negative online situation Sameer boils the above down to three easy steps:

Step 1. Pause & stay calm.Step 2. Analyze the situation.Step 3. Take action or not.
