

## **HAPPY SPRING!**



Thanks to the March CLE, presented by Emily M. Cohen, Esquire and Mary Sims, Esquire, "What you need to know about representing Applicants for Naturalization/U.S. Citizenship", I had a chance to learn more about American Immigration History.

Naturalization is the process by which a foreign-born person becomes a citizen of the United States ("U.S") (<a href="https://www.uscis.gov/n-400">https://www.uscis.gov/n-400</a>). To become a citizen, immigrants must be at least 18 years old; have been lawful permanent residents of the U.S. for five years or three years if married to a U.S. citizen; demonstrate a basic knowledge of English, American Government and American History; and have good moral character. After submitting your client's Naturalization application (N-400), the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services ("USCIS") will contact the attorney of record and applicant to schedule an interview. At the scheduled interview, a USCIS officer will:

- 1. review your client's application;
- 2. test applicant's ability to speak, read, and write in English;
- 3. test applicant's knowledge of U.S. history and government;
- 4. determine whether or not applicant is a person of good moral character; and
- 5. will make a decision on applicant's eligibility for citizenship.

When your client is approved, he (or she) will take part in a naturalization ceremony.

Since 1778 emigration to the United States has gone through multiple stages which resulted in multiple factors, both within the United States and for the immigrants' country of origin. There are multiple factors that cause emigration, including war or other social upheaval, lack of employment, economic instability, and natural disasters. The U.S.' policy on immigration has varied widely throughout its history, which has created continual change in immigration law. The Federal government's policy has alternately been guided by public sentiment, but has also driven the public's perception of immigrants and immigration in the United States.

The U.S. and the colonial society that preceded it, were created by successive waves of immigration from all corners of the globe, however, public and political attitudes towards immigrants have always been ambivalent and contradictory, and sometimes hostile. The early immigrants to Colonial America (England, France, Germany, and Europe) came in search of economic opportunity and political freedom. **By Joyce Nam**
